BOARD PAPER REFERENCE – GLA 20/8.2 – Hampton Implementation Review

<u>Issue</u>

1. This paper is for information only to appraise Board members of the Hampton Implementation review, and timescales.

Background

- 2. In July 2008 the Regulatory Enforcement and Sanctions Act 2008 was passed. This Act introduces a range of new sanctions that may be used by regulators to address identified non-compliance (the "Macrory" penalties). Schedule 5 to the Act lists the regulators who may be authorised to use the sanctions, which includes the GLA. As a first step towards being authorised to use the sanctions the GLA is required to undergo a Hampton Inspection by the Better Regulation Executive.
- 3. All regulators listed in Schedule 5 will undergo a Hampton Inspection. The Inspections will occur between September 2008 and September 2009. The aim of the inspection is to determine a regulator's compliance with Hampton principles in the manner that it discharges its responsibilities.
- 4. Regulators have been divided into three groups:
 - "Big Five" inspections completed, and used to refine the future process
 - Group 1 will undergo a comprehensive inspection (1 week on site)
 - Group 2 "light touch" review (3 days)
- 5. The GLA is in Group 1. Organisations in each of those groups are listed in Appendix 1.

Timescales and process

- 6. The GLA's inspection is scheduled for March 2009. It will be conducted by a 4 person review team drawn from: BRE, NAO, another Regulator, and an external body.
- 7. A successful inspection will allow the GLA to apply for the new sanctions. The process is set out in Appendix 2. Following approval by the Panel for Regulatory Accountability a Defra sponsored 12 week consultation will be required. At the end of this process an Affirmative order will be required by Parliament to grant the powers.
- 8. Implementation is not expected before April 2010, due to common commencement date rules. BRE do not expect any Group 1 or 2 regulators to obtain an earlier commencement date (Commencement for the "Big five" is expected to be October 2009).
